THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY!

LEAF BAG COLLECTION

The Borough will only collect leaves in biodegradable paper bags. **Please refrain from putting rocks, sticks, plastic bottles, etc. in the bags.** These items will contaminate the mulch. **Do not close leaf bags with duct tape!!** Duct tape is not biodegradable and must not be used. Please leave enough room at the top of the bag so you can either fold or roll it closed.

Biodegradable bags are available at the municipal building at a cost of \$.40 each, or you may purchase them at retail stores. The leaf mulch will be available at Blueberry Hill Park in the spring.

SPRING COLLECTION DATES: The weeks of: April 9 and April 30, 2018*
(All bags must be placed at the curb by 6:00 AM Monday morning of each week)

Leaf pick up could take several days to cover the entire Borough.

*Dates are tentative based on weather conditions, check our website for updated information.

BRUSH CHIPPING

All brush (1/2" to 4" in diameter only) must be placed at the curb by 7:00 AM on the date listed below.

SPRING COLLECTION BEGINS: Monday, April 2, 2018
(All brush must be placed at the curb by 7:00 AM)

Collection will begin on the date listed above. Brush must be placed at the curb by 7:00 AM Monday, April 2, 2018. The chipper will pass through the Borough one time. If your brush is not out at the curb when the chipper passes, you have two options: (1) take your branches to the yard waste drop off site on Blaine's Way in Blueberry Hill Park (permit required and can be obtained at the municipal building); (2) wait until the next collection date.

The chipping service may take several days to get to all areas of the Borough depending on the amount of brush placed at the curb. Although we cannot provide specific dates, they will get to your area as soon as possible.

IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT RESIDENTS HAVE YOUR BRUSH AT THE CURB ON THE FIRST MONDAY OF THE CHIPPING SEASON! PLEASE CUT AND PLACE YOUR BRUSH PERPENDICULAR TO THE CURB WITH THE BUTT END OUT.

This service is provided for brush and tree trimmings only. No thorn bushes will be accepted. If you have a tree or trees to dispose of, you must contact a private contractor. Borough crews will not spend more than 15 minutes at your home. Chips and compost are free to Borough residents only. The wood chips and leaf compost are located in Blueberry Hill Park, near McDevitt Road.

IT IS ILLEGAL TO DUMP ANYTHING IN BOROUGH PARK DUMPSTERS OR ANY OTHER AREA IN OUR PARKS.

REAL ESTATE TAXES

The Real Estate Tax Collector, Kristin Losco, is responsible for the collection of Franklin Park Borough real estate taxes and North Allegheny School District real estate taxes for the Franklin Park area, as well as the \$10.00 school per capita tax paid by every adult (21 yrs. of age or older) residing in the district.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- The Real Estate Tax Collector does not determine the “Full Market Value” of your property. Contact Allegheny County Assessment Department at 412-350-4600 with any questions.
- The Real Estate Tax Collector cannot accept post-dated checks.
- If you have refinanced your mortgage and have an escrow account with a different bank or mortgage company, please notify the Tax Office so your tax statements can be redirected.
- If you do not have an escrow account, as the homeowner you are responsible for paying the real estate taxes.
- If you do not receive a tax bill, you are responsible for calling or stopping into the Tax Office and obtaining one. Failure to receive a tax bill **does not** relieve any taxpayer from liability for prompt payment of taxes.
- If the billing address for your real estate tax bill has changed after January 1 of this year, due to refinancing, no or paid off escrow etc., please notify the Tax Office of the change.

If you, and not your lender, are responsible for making payment of your North Allegheny/Franklin Park Real Estate Taxes, be extra vigilant when determining and writing a check that it is the correct amount. It is the amount in the TOTAL DUE box for the appropriate period (discount/face/penalty). See below.

*SENIOR CITIZEN TAX RELIEF PROGRAM

In November 2004, Franklin Park Borough Council passed Ordinance No. 531-04 adopting the Senior Citizen Tax Relief Program. This program entitles all qualified senior citizens, living in the Borough of Franklin Park, to a flat 30% discount of the real estate tax on their primary residence. Below are the requirements necessary to qualify, you must meet all three requirements listed below:

Property Ownership: Must have owned and occupied a primary residence in Allegheny County continuously for the past 10 years.

Age:

- Must be age 60 or older, or if married either spouse must be age 60.
- Be a widow or widower and age 50.
- Permanently disabled and age 18 (must be verified with a physician's letter. A letter from Social Security will not be accepted.).

Income: Gross household income must be \$30,000 or less. For calculating income use only 50% of your Social Security Benefit, SSI and Railroad Retirement Tier 1 Benefits (except Medicare benefits); plus, all other income must be added in at 100%.

*HOMESTEAD/FARMSTEAD EXCLUSION INSTALLMENT PROGRAM

NO tax discount is permitted for any taxes when paying by installment. By Pennsylvania State Law, the school district must offer installment payments. Only those properties deemed eligible for the Homestead or Farmstead exclusion by the Allegheny County Assessment office will be permitted to make installment payments.

Under the installment plan, the full amount is due in three installments. Due dates are August 31/October 31/ December 31 in the respective year. The exact amount of the first payment and due date will be listed on the tax bill. If N/A appears in the installment box, it means your property is not eligible for installment payments.

The payment of the exact amount of the first installment by a taxpayer on or before the first installment due date, shall show intention to pay school taxes on the installment plan. The remaining two installment coupons will be mailed to you after the first payment is received. Installments 2 and 3 must be paid by the due dates listed above or a penalty of 10% will be added to any installment that is late. A taxpayer who is delinquent shall be ineligible for the installment payment option in the following fiscal year.

REFUSE AND RECYCLING RESIDENTIAL INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES

WASTE MANAGEMENT is currently contracted by Franklin Park Borough to collect our residential waste. The customer service phone number for Waste Management is 1-800-866-4460.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES:

We ask that you join in the Borough's efforts to increase recycling and improve the environment. To increase our efforts recycling is being picked-up weekly. The following is a list of items that can be recycled curbside and their guidelines:

- **PLASTIC** numbered 1-7 can be recycled. Any food containers with the acceptable number must be free of any food, e.g. peanut butter and mayonnaise containers, etc.
- **GLASS** food and beverage containers with lids and food debris removed: clear and colored. Labels do not have to be removed.
- **BI-METAL, STEEL AND ALUMINUM CANS**, with any food debris removed, may be placed in the recycling bin with your other recycling.
- **CARTONS** shelf-stable (also known as aseptic, such as broth, soy milk and wine) and refrigerated (also known as gable-top, such as milk, cream and juice). Place empty rinsed cartons in your recycling bin. Please remove caps and straws.
- **PAPER** (including but not limited to newsprint, junk mail, phone books, magazines and catalogs) and cardboard food boxes or similar can be placed in your recycling bin with your plastic, glass and cans. Please make sure the papers are secure either by placing them under your other items, placing them in a brown paper shopping bag, or placing them in their own bin.
- **CORRUGATED** cardboard can be placed at curbside if it is cut into 14" x 14" pieces or if the cardboard fits inside the recycling bin. Corrugated cardboard can also be placed in the four (4) dumpsters at the Municipal Building in the parking lot near the Police Department. All cardboard must be broken down before placing in dumpster.
- **BRUSH, LEAVES AND YARD WASTE**, in accordance with DEP regulations, are no longer permitted to be placed at curbside. We ask that you utilize both our Spring and Fall curbside leaf pickup and brush chipping. Leaves will **ONLY** be collected curbside during these collection times. During the Spring and Fall curbside collections the leaves should be placed in the brown biodegradable bags to be composted. Any other time you have two options 1) create a compost pile in your back yard or 2) take your leaves to the drop off site at Blueberry Hill Park. Leaves must be taken and left in brown biodegradable bags. (See the article "Yard Waste Drop Off Site" on page 7) Grass clippings can no longer be taken to the Yard Waste Drop Off Site at Blueberry Hill Park. You can do either of the following: 1) mulch your grass during the cutting process, 2) backyard composting, and 3) place your grass in plastic bags and discard with your weekly trash to be collected on your scheduled pick up day.
- **TIRES** are no longer collected by the refuse hauler at curbside.
- **PLEASE DO NOT PLACE ANY OF THE FOLLOWING OUT FOR RECYCLING:**
electronics, batteries or Styrofoam of any kind, light bulbs, unnumbered plastics, wax coated paper or cardboard and any material with food debris such as pizza boxes.

REFUSE GUIDELINES:

Garbage should be placed at the curb not before 4:00 PM on the evening before your scheduled pick up day. Residents should place all refuse in plastic garbage bags to avoid garbage from falling out on to the street. To avoid garbage bags from being torn into by animals and having garbage all over the street, you can place your bags in a trash can. Garbage cans must be removed from the curb no later than 10:00 PM the day of your garbage collection.

The “Snow Bird Clause” allows a resident to suspend service for up to five (5) months while they spend the winter months elsewhere. The resident must notify Waste Management in writing 30 days prior to the start of the suspension of service. The written notification should include the approximate date of return.

YARD WASTE DROP OFF SITE FOR RESIDENTS ONLY

The drop off site is to only be used for items such as tree or brush trimmings, leaves (placed in the designated area and kept in the brown biodegradable bags) and weeds. The same restrictions apply to both curbside brush chipping and the drop off site; only trimmings that are up to 4” in diameter can be accepted. **The Borough also asks that you please utilize the April and November curbside brush chipping and leaf collection whenever possible.**

A **permit** is required and can be obtained at no charge by completing the Yard Waste Drop Off Site application available at the Municipal Building or on our website at www.franklinparkborough.us. This site is for residential disposal only, commercial use is prohibited. Disposal of entire trees is prohibited. The Yard Waste Drop Off Site is in Blueberry Hill Park and is open March 1st to December 1st of each year.

****IMPORTANT**** The following materials are not permitted to be placed at the Yard Waste Drop Off Site: grass clippings, tree or brush trimmings larger than 4” in diameter, garbage, stumps, logs, asphalt, concrete, dirt, mulch, clay, stone, construction materials or anything that won’t degrade. Under no circumstances should anything be left in plastic bags. Placing yard waste in any dumpster or other areas of the park is strictly prohibited.

COMMERCIAL RECYCLING

PA Act 101 requires business establishments, office buildings, churches, schools and other non-profit organizations to recycle the following materials:

High-grade office paper, Corrugated cardboard
Aluminum and bi-metal beverage cans or plastic containers, Glass

If you do not have a recycling program in place you are in violation of Ordinance No. 377-91 and could face fines up to \$1,000, and costs of prosecution for each and every offense.

RECYCLING MADE EASY!! HERE'S HOW

The following chart will assist you in recycling/disposing of items commonly inquired about

CFL Bulbs	Batteries Plus, Lowes, and Home Depot stores
Concrete	DRB Concrete Recycling Facility is located next to Glenshaw Steel Supply at 1114 William Flinn Highway (Rte. 8) in Glenshaw. For more information call 412-486-5565 Monday-Friday from 8:00 am - 4:00 pm.
Corrugated Cardboard	Can be placed in the four (4) dumpsters in the Franklin Park Borough Municipal parking lot across from the Police Department. All cardboard must be broken down. Curbside collection of corrugated cardboard; must be cut to fit in recycling container.
Fire Extinguishers	Release any pressure contained in the canister by shooting it into an open area. <u>Let the canister sit for a few days, making sure the pressure gauge reads zero and all pressure has been released.</u> Once there is no longer any pressure, dispose in a trash bag in your regular garbage.
Fluorescent Bulbs	Batteries + Bulbs at 4808 McKnight Road accepts fluorescent bulbs for recycling. For more information call 412-366-3658.
Freon Containing Appliances	Appliances containing Freon such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers cannot be disposed of through curbside waste collection. Call 1-888-463-7366 or call Appliance Warehouse at 412-381-8800 for disposal. If you have the Freon removed by a qualified person, you must attach the certificate to the appliance and place at curbside. When placing the Freon free appliance curbside it is suggested that you call your refuse hauler in advance.
Household Batteries	All household batteries, Alkaline, Rechargeable, NiCad, Lithium and button batteries can be recycled at the Franklin Park Borough Municipal Building. Corroded batteries can also be brought in for recycling if they are placed separately in a plastic bag. Rechargeable batteries can also be taken to Lowes.
Household Hazardous Waste	Household hazardous waste such as paint, automotive products, garden chemicals, vehicle and household batteries, fluorescent tubes and CFLs, televisions, computers, and computer peripherals can be recycled through Waste Management's At Your Door Service which is provided to all Franklin Park residents by calling 1-800-449-7587. See the flyer on our website at www.franklinparkborough.us for a detailed list of acceptable items. (This service is included in your quarterly bill.)
Laser/Inkjet Cartridges	Target, Staples or Office Depot/Office Max stores.
Packing Peanuts & Bubble Wrap (Polystyrene Loose Fill)	Check your local UPS store
Plastic Bags	The following list is the types of bags that can be recycled: newspaper, dry cleaning, bread, produce. You can also recycle wraps that cover water bottle cases, napkins and paper towels. Local retailers such as Giant Eagle, Target, Lowes, Kuhn's, Shop-n-Save, Wal-Mart have bins specifically for bag recycling. Check out the following website to learn more about the importance of recycling plastic bags/wraps, http://abagslife.com/pennsylvania/ .

Prescription Drugs	<p>Prescription medicines can be disposed of several ways: 1) Through Project D.U.M.P (Disposal of Unused Medications Properly) through the Allegheny County Sheriff's Department by calling 412-459-5000. 2) Neighboring communities' police departments such as, Hampton, Ross, Shaler and Northern Regional offer drop-off boxes in their lobbies for prescription medications. 3) Check out our website at www.franklinparkborough.us for scheduled Take-Back events at specified locations. 4) Remove them from their original containers and mix them with an undesirable substance, such as used coffee grounds, dirt or kitty litter. Place the mixture in a sealable bag, empty can or other container to prevent the drug from leaking or breaking out of a garbage bag. DO NOT FLUSH DOWN THE TOILET OR DUMP DOWN THE DRAIN</p>
Propane Cylinders and Tanks	<p>Contact a local retailer/exchange location or scrap yard to see if they recycle old tanks.</p>
Reusable Building Materials	<p>Construction Junction in Point Breeze; building materials must be in a reusable condition. Contact/website information: 412-243-5025 or www.cjreuse.org.</p>
Smoke Detectors	<p><u>Photoelectronic</u> smoke detectors do not contain any radioactive material and can be disposed of in the municipal waste stream. Ionization smoke detectors contain a very minute amount of radioactive material known as Americium 241. It is recommended to return your old Ionization smoke detectors to the manufacturer. See the following link: about.usps.com/postal-bulletin/2012/pb22334/html/cover_025.htm. Ionization smoke detectors can be identified by a warning label on the body of the smoke detector indicating that it contains Americium 241 or look for the international symbol for radiation label.</p>
Tires	<p>It is recommended to contact a local tire retailer for disposal, there may be a small charge.</p>
Syringe Disposal	<p>You can dispose of used syringes by placing them in a "puncture-resistant, hard plastic container" (such as an empty laundry detergent bottle with a screw-on cap or an empty coffee can will do). Close the container and secure with heavy duty tape. Place the tightly sealed container in a paper bag and discard with household trash. Recommended treatment: prior to disposal disinfect used sharps with a solution of 1 teaspoon of bleach in 1/2 gallon of water. DO NOT RECYCLE USED SHARPS</p>
String Light Sets	<p>Light sets that no longer work properly can be recycled at Wexford Ace hardware. Seasonal drop off site only.</p>

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

Waste Management provides a service called “At Your Door” Special Collection as part of their residential solid waste and recycling contract with Franklin Park Borough. This curbside service gives you a convenient year-round opportunity to dispose of your household generated special materials safely, easily and responsibly.

The At Your Door Special Collection accepts E-waste such as televisions and computer systems and Hazardous Household Waste such as paint, automotive products, garden chemicals, household cleaners, vehicle and household batteries, fluorescent tubes and CFLs. Contact Waste Management’s At Your Door Service at 1-800-449-7587 to set up a pick up date.

Franklin Park Borough would like to thank its residents for being environmentally aware of the need for proper disposal of all types of batteries. We are proud to report that over 1,700 lbs. of batteries were kept out of the municipal waste stream and are being disposed of in an environmentally responsible way.

Although the Borough has a drop-off program at the municipal building, we ask that residents utilize the **At Your Door Special Collection** service through Waste Management (WM). This service provides residents with the ability to have their batteries picked up at their residence. WM will pick up any size or amount; simply contact the Call Center at 800-449-7587 to schedule a pick up. This program is available at no additional cost. 

Spring is right around the corner and so are the usual appearances that come from the thawing winter. In keeping with Franklin Park Borough values, all residents are reminded of the “Good Neighbor” policies to keep the high standards that have placed the borough in the top 50 communities in the USA. Each resident can help by quickly reviewing the Franklin Park codified ordinances summarized below:

SECTION 302.4 GRASS AND WEEDS. Residents must keep lawns trimmed. Plants maintained for some useful or ornamental purpose are permitted to exceed a height of 10 inches.

SECTION 308.1 UNLAWFUL CONDITIONS AND DEPOSITS. Cannot leave property in a state which is detrimental to the property values of other properties in the neighborhood. This includes, but is not limited to, depositing of: building material, abandoned, discarded or unused objects or items such as automobiles, furniture, stoves, refrigerators, freezers, cans or containers or any unsanitary matter on any property.

SECTION 302.8 MOTOR VEHICLES. No person in charge of or in control of private property, whether as owner, lessee, tenant, occupant or otherwise, shall allow any inoperable motor vehicle to remain on such property longer than 10 days; and no person shall leave any inoperable motor vehicle on any property within the Borough of Franklin Park for a longer time than 10 days.

SECTION 212-2502 BUILDING AND ZONING PERMITS. No land use may be established or changed, no structure or building may be erected, constructed, reconstructed, altered, razed or removed and no building or structure may be used or occupied or changed in use until a zoning permit has been secured from the Zoning Officer.

Residents should be mindful of the condition of their property. Keeping yards maintained and property values up is important to property owners in the borough. Franklin Park is one of the most beautiful communities in the Pittsburgh area. Let's keep it that way. 2018 BUDGET SUMMARY

GENERAL FUND (GF)

The Borough's present financial position will allow Franklin Park to fund the current level of services being provided, the initiatives established by Council and Mayor and many of the additional services and projects proposed by the department directors. The 2018 Budget prioritizes the depreciation of all equipment and the upgrade of many borough facilities. In determining which projects to approve, Borough Council and Mayor had to balance competing interests of all departments.

The 2018 General Fund beginning cash balance is estimated at \$2.6 million. Given the Borough's growing population, GF revenues should continue to increase during the next several years. Coinciding with this increase will be the responsibility to improve roads, parks and other facilities so that amenities that exist today are maintained for future generations.

2018 General Fund budgeted expenditures are projected to increase 10.8% over the 2017 level. To balance the General Fund, Council allocated \$1,219,665 from the 2017 year-end surplus. Primarily, these funds will be used for capital improvements. The Borough should finish 2018 with a \$1.4 million unrestricted cash reserve, which equals 14.3 % of the budget.




THE MAJOR INITIATIVES IN THIS YEAR'S BUDGET ARE:

- Improvements to the I-79 & S.R. 910 traffic lights, contingent upon grant approval.
- Improvements to Blueberry Hill Park: replace the football field announcer's booth, install two pickleball courts, resurface basketball court, improve park entrance and upgrade Blueberry Patch.
- Construct a memorial picnic pavilion at Linbrook Park.
- Pave the walking trail, construct a pickle ball court and install outdoor adult exercise equipment at Old Orchard Park.
- Construct a picnic shelter at Clover Hill Golf Course.
- Upgrade the borough website.
- Install security cameras at various borough owned facilities.
- Make upgrades to several other facilities and fully replace all depreciated equipment.
- Work with Penn DOT and state elected officials to improve the I-79 & S.R. 910 Corridor.
- Begin the MS-4 stormwater improvements by retrofitting two detention facilities.

2017 REVENUE & EXPENDITURE PIE CHARTS



Over the past several years Franklin Park has received numerous positive rankings, including being named one of the top 50 suburbs in the U.S. Just recently, the Borough was named the best place to raise a family in PA. Franklin Park remains an attractive residential destination. Currently, there are eleven housing developments under construction. The approved developments contain 931 lots for which 593 building permits have been issued, leaving an additional 338 lots available for new construction. Additionally, the Borough continues to receive inquiries for residential housing opportunities from developers. The above data suggests new residents will continue to move into Franklin Park.

In summary, the 2018 General Fund Budget maintains the current service levels for borough residents. It prepares the Borough for the future by improving and expanding transportation and recreation facilities. It addresses our residents' public safety needs by providing significant funding for the Franklin Park Police and Volunteer Fire Company. Based on an analysis of survey data gathered by the North Hills Council of Governments, the Borough continues to provide a very efficient and effective level of service to its residents. And, Franklin Park continues to have one of the lowest real estate tax rates of the 134 communities in Allegheny County.

Fire Fund. (Established in 2016)

With financial backing of the Borough, the Franklin Park Volunteer Fire Company built a new fire station in 2017. Construction was substantially completed on January 31, 2018. The new station culminates a three-year effort by the VFC and the Borough, which will enhance the VFC's ability to provide up to date fire and rescue services to the residents of our community.

The funding arrangement agreed to by Council, Mayor and the VFC provides the resources necessary to depreciate all VFC equipment and to purchase additional pieces which may be necessary. The funding plan projects the needs of the VFC well into 2040; however, each year at budget time the plan is reviewed and updated, as necessary.

Clover Hill Golf Course Fund

In 2018 CHGC will maintain the existing level of service it provides. The Budget also approved a small pavilion to compliment league play, completing the paving of the parking lot and replacing older pull carts.

Capital Reserve Fund

Based on the Asset Management Plan the Borough should spend approximately \$1,673,086 annually to depreciate its equipment, facilities and infrastructure. The total amount in the 2018 Capital Budget for equipment depreciation and facility improvements is \$1,874,255. Additionally, the GF allocates \$1,000,745 for curb, catch basin repairs and street resurfacing, bringing the total capital expenditure to \$2,875,000. The above data suggests Franklin Park fully depreciates its capital assets and is adding to or improving existing facilities to accommodate future population growth.

SECURITY CAMERA INVESTMENT PAYS OFF

Last year Franklin Park in cooperation with Marshall Township and the Allegheny County District Attorney's Office installed cameras at the I-79 & SR 910 Corridor. The camera technology includes automated license plate reading capability. The technology immediately alerts law enforcement if the license plate of a wanted individual goes through the corridor. The cameras have lived up to and exceeded expectation. Here are a sample of the types of crimes, accidents and other incidents the cameras helped to:

- Solve the theft of copper from a local gas station
- Solve a drunk driver hit and run incident
- Solve four burglaries & multiple thefts
- Increase surveillance regarding drug activity at or near the corridor area
- Eliminate disagreements regarding which driver is at fault when vehicular accidents occur

Many local businesses made voluntary contributions toward this project. A big shout out and thank you to each local business who contributed toward this project.

The Borough is currently seeking bids to install a similar surveillance system at other borough owned facilities, including municipal parks. The system is expected to be operational this summer.

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVED

Based on an increasing number of auto accidents in the Borough, many of which were on Brandt School Road, Police Chief Don Dorsch and Public Works Superintendent Bernie Rossman evaluated the cause and proposed several solutions. Based on the report, Council and Mayor authorized the following improvements:

- A flashing speed sign on the northbound lane of Brandt School Road, south of Pine Creek Road
- A flashing stop sign at the intersection of Pine Creek and Brandt School Road
- A flashing stop sign at the intersection of Wexford Run and Brandt School Road
- Road marking on Brandt School Road advising drivers of the road alignment and advising to slow down
- A flashing speed sign on the southbound lane of Brandt School Road, north of Wexford Run Road

The improvements advised drivers of road conditions which existed ahead. The borough actions reduced the number of reportable auto accidents from 185 in 2013 to 133 in 2017, a decrease of 28.1 %. Additionally, non-reportable accidents also decreased significantly.

Auto accidents caused by deer-auto collisions are also down. In 2016 the police department had 59 reportable accidents. In 2017 that number fell to 40.

A SAFETY ZONE FOR INTERNET DEALS AND TRANSACTIONS

Borough Council and Mayor have authorized the Police Department to set aside a parking space, located at the entrance door to the police department, for residents who are conducting deals with internet transactions and other deals involving monetary or product exchanges.

The intent is to give the residents a safe place for transactions. However, to guard against fraud residents should always take precautions with any transaction involving checks or any other kind of monetary payment.

The police department would also like the public to understand we will not act as monitors or be involved in any disputes during the transactions unless it is of a criminal nature.


